Nepal's diverse and evolving context has shaped a unique landscape of socio-economic vulnerability. Geographic, socio-political, and economic factors intersect to influence the lives of its people. Vulnerability is a dynamic state influenced by various internal and external factors, including climate change, social behaviors, economic conditions, human mobility, agriculture practices, and exposure to violence. While traditional definitions often focus on poverty, discrimination, and marginalization, evolving societal dynamics require a more nuanced understanding. The constitution ensures equal rights for vulnerable groups, but challenges remain in implementation. To effectively address vulnerability, it is essential to reconsider existing frameworks and adopt a more contextualized approach that accounts for the evolving nature of vulnerability and its multifaceted determinants.

In support of UNDP Nepal, Pokhara University is organizing a symposium on "Contextualizing the Understanding of Socio-Economic Vulnerability in Nepal". The symposium will bring together academicians, practitioners, policymakers, and political leaders to explore socio-economic vulnerability within the framework of the Sustainable Development Goals and human development in Nepal. It will provide a platform to discuss about various perspectives on vulnerability and identify new dimensions and approaches that can help state authorities, development partners, and the private sector reconsider who qualifies as vulnerable and how best to address their needs.

The key themes for discussion include economic inequalities, social stratification, climate change and disasters, and food, nutrition and health particularly, social structures, environmental and geographical dimensions, and factors, policy and governance, and community perspectives. The conference will involve open paper submissions, panel discussions, and a final report.

The expected specific outcomes of the symposium are:

- An enhanced understanding of socio-economic vulnerability in the Nepali context.
- Practical recommendations for policy and programmatic interventions.
- Strengthened collaboration among stakeholders.
- Increased awareness and engagement of local communities in addressing socio-economic challenges.
